
The talk will be presented by Trevor Vaugh, of RTE's 'Big Life Fix'. Trevor is Assistant Professor in the Department of Design Innovation and lectures on the Masters in Design Innovation. He is also the Principal investigator at the Maynooth innovation lab (Mi:Lab), a collaboration with the HEA. He serves as a Board Member of the Public Sector Innovation Advisory Board and is a member of the Expert Working Group for the Department of Further and Higher Education, Research, Innovation and Science.

What is Design Thinking?

Design Thinking is a problem-solving methodology that puts the user at the centre of the process surrounded by the core principles of having empathy for the user, interdisciplinary teamwork and rapid prototyping of the solution or idea. This approach is often used in the world of business and yet it is incredibly suited to the healthcare industry due to its 'human-centred' focus.















Design thinking for better healthcare

Participants will be introduced to the proven and accessible approach to Design Thinking (DT) to innovate and solve problems that impact healthcare and patient lives. You will learn more about the DT problem-solving methodology to reframe and think of your ideas with a human-centred approach. You will hear about real challenges that may inspire you to explore solutions to improving the patient pathway in hospitals, medical devices, processes, and more.

The focus will be on helping the participant implement the DT process and learning how design thinking can foster new approaches to complex and persistent healthcare problems through human-centred research, collective and diverse teamwork and rapid prototyping. The talk aims to equip participants with a comprehensive understanding of DT and to encourage them to ideate, test and prototype solutions.
